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LEGAL NOTICE NO. 14 OF 1992

**Declaration of Land set aside for public purposes
(Land subject of allocation)**

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 54 (1) of the Land Act 1979, read together with section 38(b) of the National Constituent Assembly Order 1990, I,

Mphosi Matete

Minister of Interior and Chieftainship Affairs, after having consulted with the Principal Chief having jurisdiction over the area and having obtained the Military Council's assent hereby declare that the land described in this notice is set aside for public purposes.

Description: Every right or interest in and to the land including buildings and other improvements thereon over the land shown on miscellaneous plan No. 1/91 held in the office of the Chief Surveyor, Maseru, in extent 12.4 hectares more or less.

Purpose: The Land is required for the provision of public utility services as an extension to Ratjomose sewerage works.

Date of Surrender: On the date of publication of this Notice in the Gazette, all interests in or affecting the said land shall cease to subsist and the lessors interest in the land shall revert to the State.

Claims: Any person having a claim in the land so set aside may submit his claim for compensation to me by forwarding details thereof to the Commissioner of Lands P.O. Box 876, Maseru 100 within three (3) months of the date of publication of this notice in the Gazette.

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 28 OF 1992

**Agricultural Marketing
(Trading in Fruits and Vegetables) Regulations, 1992**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 4 A. 26 of 1967 of the Agricultural Marketing Act, 1967, I

James Lebitso Dingiswayo

Minister of Agriculture, Cooperatives and Marketing make the following regulations,

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Marketing (Trading in Fruits and Vegetables) Regulations, 1992 and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the Gazette. Citation and commencement
- 2. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used shall have the same respective meaning as in the Agricultural Marketing Act 1967. Interpretation
- 3. All persons wishing to import fruits and vegetables into Lesotho shall do so only when in possession of a permit issued by the Principal Secretary responsible for the Ministry of Agriculture, Cooperatives and Marketing. Importation of fruits and vegetables
- 4. All persons wishing to obtain a permit referred to in regulation 3, for the importation of fruits and vegetables shall do so by application to the Principal Secretary responsible for the Ministry of Agriculture, Cooperatives and Marketing. Application for permits
- 5. These regulations shall not apply to personal imports of fruits and vegetables not exceeding 2 kilograms. Exceptions
- 6. (1) any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable, Offences and penalties
 - (a) on first conviction to a fine not exceeding M200 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 6 months or to both such fine and imprisonment;
 - (b) on second or subsequent conviction to a fine not exceeding M2,000 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 2 years or to both such fine and imprisonment;
- (2) Any fruits or vegetables illegally imported into Lesotho shall be liable to forfeiture and seizure in accordance with section 88 and 89 of the Customs and Excise Act, 1982. A. 10 of 1982
- 7. All fruits or vegetables imported into Lesotho contrary to regulation 3 shall be dealt with in accordance with section 91 of the Customs and Excise Act 1982: Disposal of seized fruits or vegetables

Provided that such fruits or vegetables shall not be disposed of until 48 hours have elapsed after seizure, during which time the seized fruits or vegetables may be released to the importer if he satisfied the Director of Customs and

Excise that the fruits or vegetables were imported legally:

Provided further that such seized fruits or vegetables may be disposed of by giving them to any government institution.
